## **NO Plastic Bags & Film**

## **NO Electronics & Small Appliances**

## **NO Recyclables in Plastic Bags**

Empty loose recyclables in bin but leave the plastic bag out.



## **NO Holiday Lights**

## **NO Ribbons, Bows, Foil & Glitter Wrapping Paper**

Plain, paper-based wrapping paper can be recycled.



## **NO Trees, Tinsel, & Ornaments**

Donate these items if they are in good condition. Otherwise, they belong in the trash.



## **NO Clothing**

Donate these items if they are in good condition. Otherwise, they belong in the trash.
